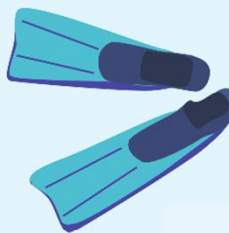
Learn about snorkeling gear and skills for safety and fun!

The four basic snorkeling items Check for problems with these devices before using them.



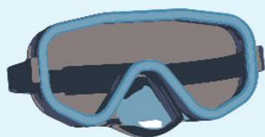
Lifejacket(with whistle)

Choose suitable size and wear the lifejacket. Tighten and secure the buckles and straps, including the crotch strap.



Fins

Choose the right size for your feet, and wear the fins securely. Learn how to fin-kick properly.



Mask

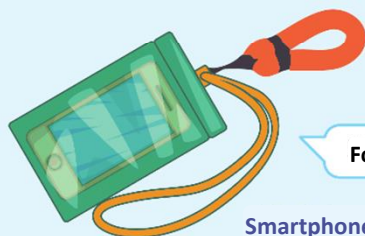
Choose the right size for your face shape, and wear the mask securely. Learn how to clear the mask when water enters it.



Snorkel

Attach the snorkel facing in the right direction, and take slow, deep breaths. Learn how to clear it of water.

Keep communication gear



Smartphone with protective case

A floatation strap can be attached.

For emergency calls!

Maintain warmth and body protection



Wetsuit



Surf shoes



Surf gloves

In a safe water area where your feet reach the bottom. Practice basic skills



Mask-clearing

When water enters the mask, hold the top of the mask with your hand and exhale through your nose to drain it.



snorkel-clearing

If water enters the snorkel, exhale vigorously to drain the water.



Fin-kicking

Relax, and without bending your knees, kick with a large movement from the base of the leg.



How to change posture in the water

Twist your body from a prone position, orient yourself vertically, and "walk" with fins on.

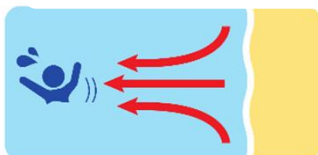
